



The Dental team is coming to Broadlands School on 20<sup>th</sup> June for a visit to apply a fluoride varnish to help provide extra protection to your child's teeth.

Fluoride is a mineral that occurs naturally in some water sources. Fluoride helps protect both child and adult teeth by strengthening tooth enamel. Fluoride replaces the minerals lost on the surface of the teeth during early stages of tooth decay.

#### What will we do?

 Apply a protective coating of fluoride to your child's teeth.


If you are interested for your child to be involved, please discuss at home, then if OK, sign the attached slip below and return to the Office by Friday 14 June.


