



MoE Attendance - Important to Know!

FYI, as a requirement, any students who have five days of unjustified absence in a term will now need 'Intervention' recorded against them on our electronic attendance system called ENROL. This information will be automatically sent to the MoE each week.

This is **important** for you to know, as it is also a legal requirement that we are informed, by you, of the REASON for your child's absence and IF it is JUSTIFIABLE.

Two common reasons considered UNJUSTIFIED are:

"\_\_\_\_ slept in."

"\_\_\_\_ is not at school today."

If we do not receive any message at all for a child being absent, they will be recorded as a 'Truant'.

Please use phone, text, email, website or SchoolApp to inform us of a child's absence AND the REASON by 9.30am.

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Biking


