



WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Calves, Lambs and Kids

These pets need to be born between Saturday 20 July - Wednesday 25 September. Children are expected to present their pets to the judges in a well-cared for condition. They will lead and call their pet and talk to the judges about how they have cared for them. Parents need to transport these pets to school with a lead and drinking water. Pets are to be tethered to the fence along side the field and children are expected to stay with their pet. Adults are not allowed with children and pets while judging is taking place, however, there will be stewards who will help your child with their pet. When your child hands in their pet day form they will be given a booklet for calves and lambs that covers this in much more detail.

Dogs

Dogs need to have a nice nature to attend Calf & Pet Day. They are to be tethered all day under the trees by the senior playground on the field. Children are expected to lead and call their dog as well as talk to the judges about how they care for them.

Domestic Pets

Your domestic pet needs to be contained in an enclosure, which will be kept in a classroom. Your child is expected to stay with their pet and talk to the judges about how they care for them. These pets need to be brought to school by parents.

Myths and Legends Creations

This is a Myths and Legends themed creativity competition. Children can enter a creation made at home which fits into any of these three categories.

- 1. Edible creations e.g. cupcake creations, vegetable creations etc...
- 2. Arts and crafts e.g. recyclable/reusable creations, knitted craft, fabrics etc...
- 3. Digital art e.g. stop motion animation, photography, video/movies, programming etc...

Pre-schoolers

We welcome pre-schoolers to bring along a pet. There will be a special ring for calves and lambs only on
the field which they can walk around with their pet. They are allowed parental help.

Pet Parade

Dress up your self and your pet any way you like. There is no theme for this. Everyone will walk in procession showing off their beautifully dressed pets. Prizes will be awarded for the best costumes.

Whanau Entertainment

Pet Day is a great day out for families, come and watch the children in the competition rings, stroll through the Myths and Legends creative competition entries, buy raffle tickets, enjoy baking, BBQ, coffee and cold drinks in the spring sunshine.



The theme for the arts and crafts, visual arts, digital arts and cupcake decorating for Calf & Pet Day 2024 is Maori Myths and Legends.

Myths and Legends are traditional tales. Myths often refer to the supernatural and the sacred and legends are historical fact).

Teachers are reading a range of Myths and Legends during class time and every student will create a piece of visual art during class time to display at Calf & Pet Day.


